Perhaps you were born for such a time as this. ~ Esther 4:14

Esther saved an entire race of people. The Jews were on the brink of extinction due to the pride and hatred of Jews harbored in Haman's heart. Esther risked her own life for a chance to save the lives of her people. She was hesitant, much like we are hesitant to take risk in doing what is right. Her cousin (some believe uncle), Mordecai, suggested she became Queen "for a time such as this." I will not spoil the chance for you to read the story for yourself. There were many surprising turn of events that strategically positioned Esther and Mordecai to have the opportunity, and authority, to act on behalf of the Jews.
