Food Pantry Expands to Meet Rising Demand

Over the past three years, the Smith Mountain Lake region has seen a sharp increase in poverty and food insecurity. As household budgets are stretched thin by rising costs, more families are turning to Lake Christian Ministries (LCM) for support—and our food pantry must expand to meet this urgent need.

Between 2022 and 2024, LCM experienced a 53% increase in overall client numbers and a 65% surge in food pantry requests. In 2024 alone, LCM served 3,761 unduplicated individuals, fulfilling 14,178 food orders—enough to provide 254,400 meals.

To meet these growing needs, LCM opened a second facility in September 2024. This new space now houses the clothing selection area, a warehouse for furniture and household goods, and a Learning Center. Renovations to the existing building allowed LCM to add five offices for financial aid, the New Tomorrows Program, and services provided by our community partners.

Now LCM is tackling the next critical need: expanding the food pantry. The final phase of renovation will double the pantry's size by repurposing space formerly used for sorting donations. This expansion will improve workflow and reduce long client wait times.

"On busy days, families are waiting up to 45 minutes to receive food," said Executive Director Jane Winters. "We want clients to have time to visit other areas—clothing, furniture or financial services—without being delayed by food order fulfillment."

The project includes electrical upgrades, HVAC installation, wall modifications, and additional shelving to handle large pallet deliveries. Much of the labor will be done by volunteers to reduce costs. LCM has been blessed with an anonymous donation that will address nearly 90% of the renovation costs. Service Impact

During the first four months of 2025, Lake Christian Ministries volunteers and staff fulfilled a growing number of requests for food assistance. Rising costs for housing, utility service, and food continue to significantly impact low-income families who are struggling to make ends meet. Hospitality Certification Classes Help Clients Secure Jobs

Lake Christian Ministries is partnering with Bedford County Adult Education to offer hospitality certification classes for neighbors in need. This partnership recognizes that earning certification for an in-demand, well-paying job can be key to breaking the poverty cycle for an individual or family.

American Hospitality and Lodging Certifications are nationally recognized and are required for employment by many commercial establishments such as hotels, restaurants, and retail stores. Classes which began at LCM in April include Front Desk Representative, Guest Room Attendant, and Maintenance Employee Certifications.

Each course spans 12 hours and is held on Mondays from 4 to 7 p.m. for four weeks in LCM's Wish You Well Learning Center. We are grateful to **Michelle and David Baldacci**, who donated the funding to create this beautiful and functional space where we can also offer GED, literacy, nutrition, and career-building classes to our clients.

Kathy Smith, Bedford County Public Schools and local GED Coordinator, and Michelle Swanson, LCM's New Tomorrows Director, are working together to select the courses that will be the most beneficial for LCM's clients. Planned for this fall are certification courses for Restaurant Server, Kitchen Cook, and Tourism Assistant.

Participants also practice interviewing, learn how to write a resume, and learn how to recognize and report human trafficking. LCM shares monthly job postings with class participants. With an American Hospitality and Lodging Association certificate, a professional resume, and good interviewing skills, graduates have an advantage over many others who may apply for the same jobs.


